



Reflections of Migration and cultural diversity in Films and Theatre Can Cinema and Theatre tell the sideline stories?

30th June - 2nd July 2023 | | Berlin

In recent decades, the question of migration, diversity and multicultural society has opened up a lot of debates and has become a major social issue. During this seminar, we will be exploring the role of Films and Theatre in addressing these concerns and, showing how society constructs its relationship with 'Otherness' through the portrayal of its diversity. Films and Theatre can provide a platform for ethical representation which can break the pre-existing stereotypes and misrepresentation of diversity/migrants leading to better integration and representation of migrants in society and initiating a social dialogue on questions of cultural diversity, attitude towards migration, identity politics, discrimination, racism, etc.

The seminar will address questions such as: How do the films and theatre portray migration and cultural diversity, and how does it open the debate on these issues, in an increasingly globalized world? How can the film and theatre industry of Europe/Germany provide a space for equal inclusion and representation of BIPOC? How is the often-overlooked question of racial segregation and discrimination within the artistic domain reflected on the stage and screen? Can films and theatre be the forebearers of change in the power dynamics of the social narrative, where the centre is not overpowering the marginalized? Do cinema and theatre create a space for narrating the stories of the 'other' with diverse and complex backgrounds? What role do cultural institutions and policies play in better inclusion and plurality of voices in an industry dominated by a mainstream narrative?

With the wide and popular reach of films and theatre, it is important to scrutinize the complexities of this cultural industry involved in dealing with this issue. This seminar intends to investigate what has been done by these institutions in having a plurality of voices and how successful or unsuccessful they have been in creating a shared space for diverse identities and affecting social change.
